**WOMEN'S PATRIOTIC SOCIETY REPORT**

Monkton, Sept. 15th, 1919.

The following is a report of the secretary and treasurer of the Women's Patriotic Society, Monkton, of the work done during the term of organization, Sept. 1914 to July, 1919.

During the term of our organization 5,197 pairs of socks were knit. Out of this number 2,000 pairs were sent directly to our boys. The others were sent to the headquarters of the Red Cross Society. Articles of clothing, such as vermin suits, pyjamas, stretcher caps, wristlets, etc. were made and disposed of. Some were sent to headquarters to be used in the hospitals overseas, while others were sent to our own boys in monthly parcels. These articles were valued at \$7,764.13. Monthly parcels were sent overseas to our own boys. Total number of parcels sent 995, valued at \$3,880.00.—Mrs. Ed. Bettger, secretary W.P.S.
